

## Bulgaria Hate Crime Report 2022

### Summary

Bulgaria regularly reports hate crime data to ODIHR. Bulgaria implemented ODIHR's Training Against Hate Crime for Law Enforcement (TAHCLE) programme from 2012 until 2017. Bulgaria also took part in ODIHR's project on "Building a Comprehensive Criminal Justice Response to Hate Crime", helping to develop a joint training programme for police and prosecutors that was piloted in the country. Bulgaria has also made efforts to improve hate crime identification, recording and data collection systems through ODIHR's Information Against Hate Crimes Toolkit (INFAHCT) programme. ODIHR completed a [review](#) of Bulgaria's hate crime legislation in 2018.

### ODIHR's Key Observation

ODIHR recognizes Bulgaria's efforts to report information on hate crimes to ODIHR. However, it observes that Bulgaria has not reported statistics on hate crimes to ODIHR. In addition, ODIHR observes that Bulgaria would benefit from reviewing its existing legal framework to ensure that bias motivations can be effectively acknowledged and appropriate penalties can be imposed on the perpetrators.

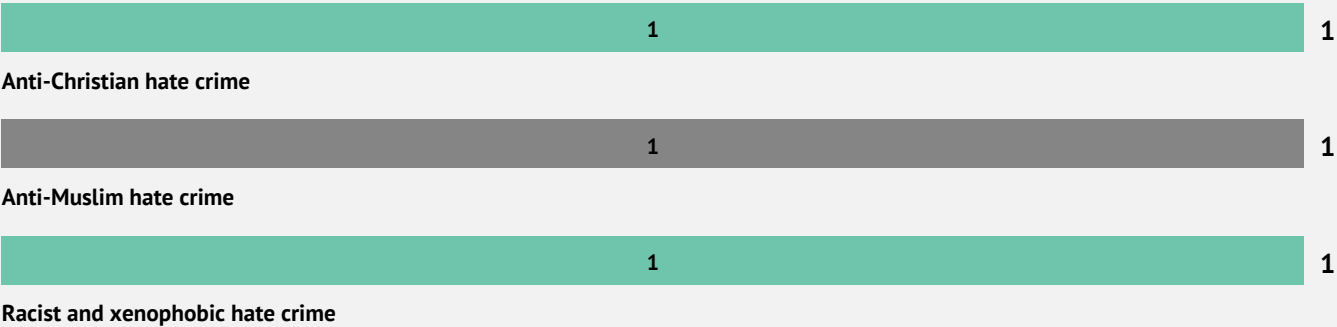

## National Developments

The General Directorate National Police (GDNP) has been implementing a project on "Improving co-ordination and dialogue between the police and the Roma community", funded by the Norwegian Financial Mechanism. # Incidents reported by civil society

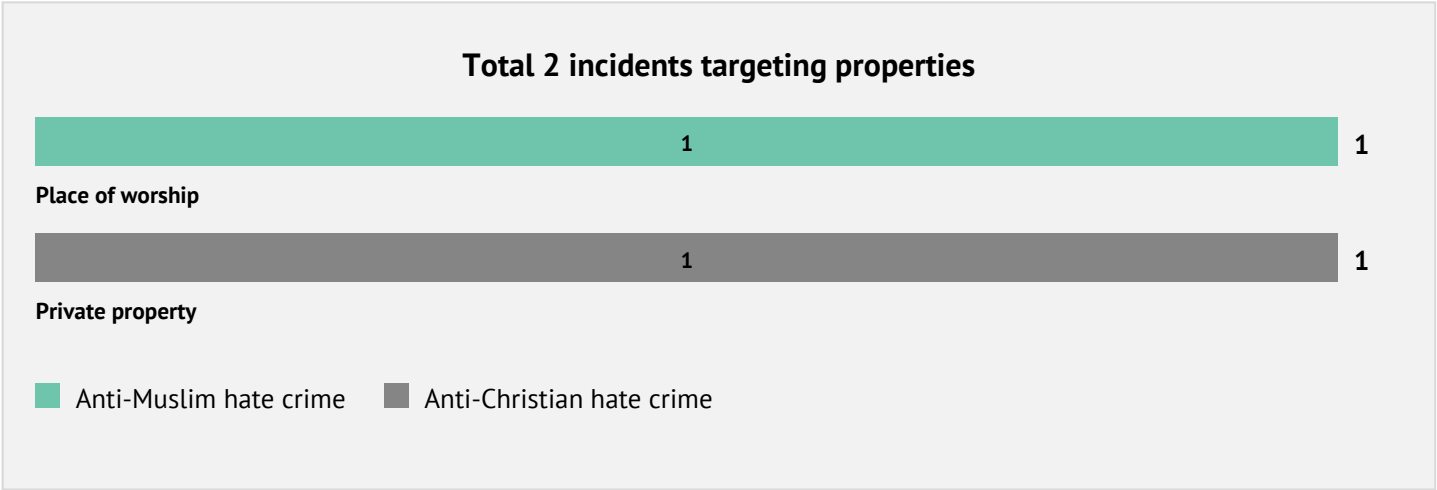
Total 3 incidents



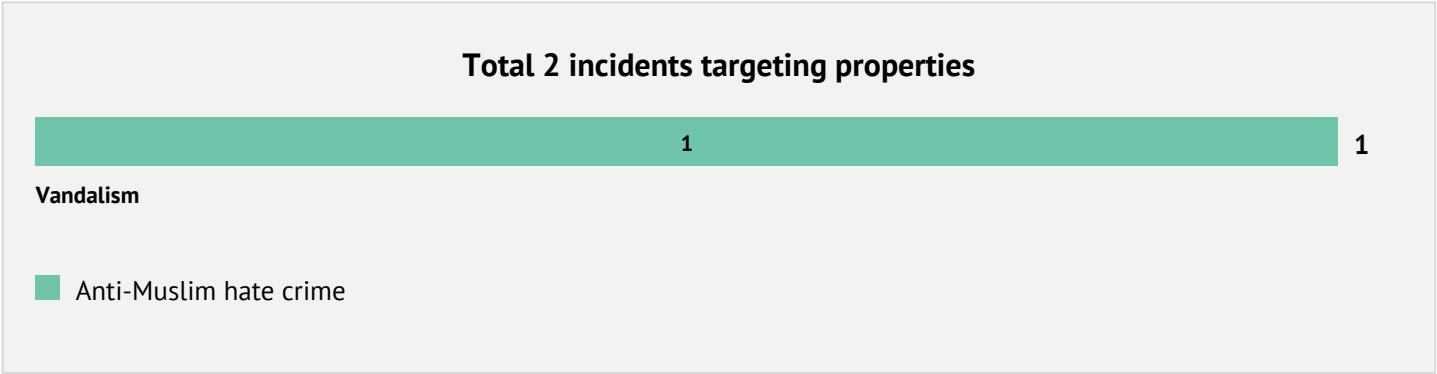
Violent attacks against people   Attacks against property
